- **Join the Fall Hike to see the Autumn Colors!** Scheduled for Sat, 10/24, rain date 10/25, at NJ Audubon's Plainsboro Preserve, 80 Scotts Corner Road, Cranbury. We will meet in the parking lot at 10 am (members can arrange their own transportation/carpool, as they feel comfortable.) There are approximately 5 miles of trails in the preserve and we plan to walk the wide lakeside White Trail and Maggie's Trail, about 2 miles round trip. The difficulty of these trails range from easy to moderate, making them a wonderful place to hike for most everyone. See the Trail Map included with this newsletter. No picnicking is allowed, but you may want to bring a bag lunch to

eat in the car afterwards. To honor social distancing, this will be open to FWC members only, and be sure to wear a mask.

- **Stream clean-up** – Two FWC members, Phyllis Beals and Nancy Gale, participated in the Franklin Township Annual John Clyde stream clean-up of Seeley's Run, a brook that runs between IHop and the Stop & Shop Plaza on Easton Ave, and into the Raritan River. They contributed four hours of service and picked up four bags of recyclables and trash.
- **Plastic Pollution Reduction Act** – NJ State lawmakers recently passed a bill (S864/A1978) that would limit the use of single-use plastic bags, paper bags, plastic straws and polystyrene (Styrofoam) food containers in New Jersey. The measure is an attempt to reduce the amount of waste generated in the state, and will reduce the 4.4 billion single-use plastic bags New Jerseyans use annually, cutting down on the amount of plastic that pollutes our rivers, oceans, and open spaces. It is awaiting Gov Murphy's signature and will become effective 18-months after signature, except for the straw ban (straws available only upon request) which has a year-long grace period.

We can all do our part to take actions that make our homes more sustainable, from fall lawn care, to home energy efficiency, to adapting to coastal flooding. Also included are two RU Wildlife Wise sessions with the Rutgers Wildlife Conservation and Management Program including a special Halloween edition! **Shot@Life:** We will continue to donate to this United Nations Foundation campaign to help stem the deaths of children who die each year because they do not have access to immunizations. In lieu of using the pink canister at in-person meetings, members may mail a check for a small amount to my home, 10 Robert C. Keri Court, Somerset, 08873, or wrap a dollar or two in a sheet of paper and mail to me. Also, Phyllis Beals has kindly agreed to accept donations by Venmo.

It's more important than ever to get your flu shot this year. Like GFWC, Walgreen's is an official [Shot@Life](#) Partner. From now through the end of December, they will donate \$0.23 for every shot that they give to people. Whether you get your flu shot at Walgreen's or elsewhere, the cost will be covered by insurance/Medicare, in most cases.

**Operation Smile :** This organization provides free surgery to correct cleft lip and/or palate for children whose families would otherwise have been unable to afford it or travel for it. We are helping by making Smile Bags. "After receiving surgery, each child receives a Smile Bag, the perfect gift to cheer up a healing child. Smile Bags are filled with small personal care items as well as toys, stickers and a mirror to see their new smile." We encourage all FWC members to register and vote in the upcoming election. Voting in New Jersey this year will take place primarily by mail. All registered voters will receive a postage-paid ballot through the mail in early October. Voters are encouraged to fill out and return their ballots well before **Election Day, November 3**.

To be eligible to vote in the upcoming election, you must register to vote by **Tuesday, October 13**. If you are not already registered, here is the voter registration form for Somerset County: <https://nj.gov/state/elections/assets/pdf/forms-voter-registration/68-voter-registration-english-somerset.pdf>

If you wish to do so, you can set up an account so that you can track your ballot after you have mailed it or placed it in a designated election drop box. Go to: <https://www.state.nj.us/state/elections/vote-track-my-ballot.shtml>. In setting up your account, you will be asked to provide your driver's license number, the last four digits of your social security number, or your voter ID. The above website provides a link you can click to find your voter ID. You also will be asked to create a Public Access ID (which is another way of saying User Name) and a Password.

- For those who want more information, Mary Lou has provided the following set of step-by-step instructions for how to track your ballot based on her experience:

### **Information About Tracking Your Mail-In-Ballot**

The following steps will take you to the NJ Board of Elections website where you can see the status of your mail-in-ballot once the County receives it:

- 1) Take a photo of or make a note of your name and address, as well as the Voter ID code under your address on the ballot you received in the mail. The Voter ID code begins with a letter, such as "P." You will need this code to set up your account in the system.
- 2) Here is the website address for you to set up an account to track your ballot [www.nj.gov/state/elections/vote-track-my-ballot.shtml](http://www.nj.gov/state/elections/vote-track-my-ballot.shtml)
- 3) Once you're on the site, find the "Track Your Ballot" box toward the bottom of the page.
- 4) Select the "Setup Your NJ Voter Information System Account" tab. Fill in your Identification Information as it appears on the outer Ballot envelope, same as in the photo or note you made.
- 5) Then go to the Drop Down Menu that is labeled "Driver's License," open the Drop Down, and select Voter ID.
- 6) Then enter the ID code under your address on the outer Ballot envelope (it starts with a letter), in the box immediately to the right.
- 7) After you enter that in, where it says "Public Access ID," give yourself a User Name, and then proceed to enter Email, and enter a Password. Make a note of your user name and password.
- 8) Select a secret question and answer, making a note of them, and then select "Sign Up." You should be all set to come back to the site to sign in and check your account and ballot status.
